

The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Are you 18 years of age and registered to vote?



Do you approve or disapprove of the job Joe Biden is doing as President?





Do you believe that the state of South Dakota is currently on the right track or wrong track?





















Someone who was born male but identifies as a woman commits a crime and is sentenced to prison should serve their sentence in a women's prison, and be allowed to share a cell with a woman.

























What is your ethnicity?




